Leaflets

Lactation consultant

At the CJG in Capelle aan den IJssel, we work with a lactation consultant - a breastfeeding specialist. If you are experiencing any breastfeeding problems that require extra support, the paediatric nurse or paediatrician can ask the lactation consultant for help.
